On-site programming was coordinated at various sites throughout the year. The objective is to promote the visionary work of both the artists and the Land Trust, which culminated in an exhibition at Gallery 224 in September.

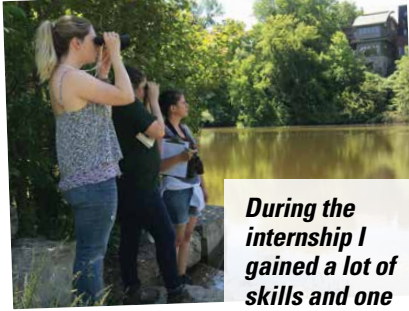

KEEPING TRACK OF BEES

Data gathered from the Bombus survey conducted at Turtle Park showed the following results: 14 different species of Bombus identified, with the most common species found:

- Auricomus, Black and Gold – 7
- Bimaculatus, Two-spotted – 4
- Impatiens, Common Eastern – 4
- Vagans, Half Black – 3
- Rufocinctus, Red-belted – 3

Bees were found foraging mostly on Bergamot, Black-eyed Susan and Common Milkweed.

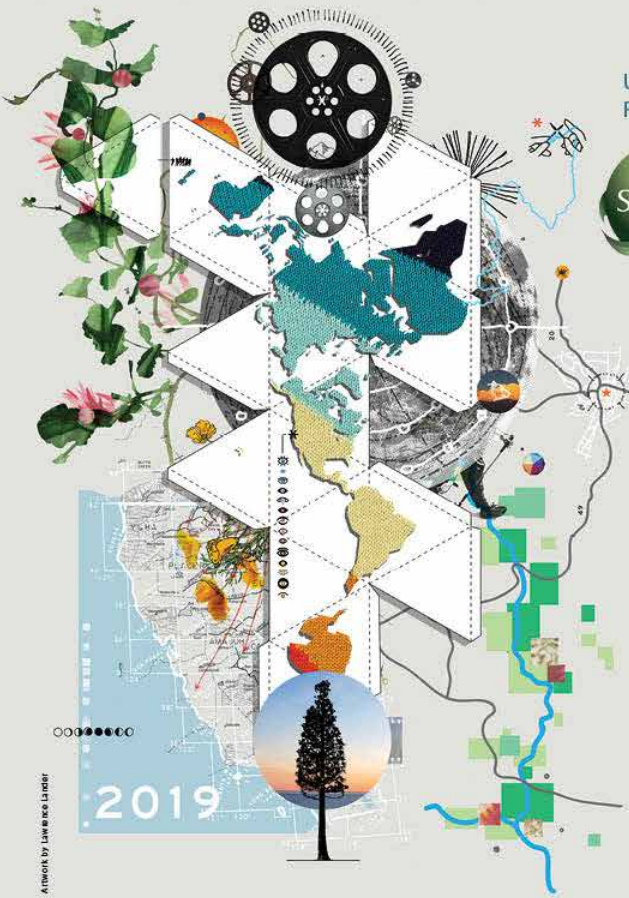
